Kindly refer your office Letter No: CW-II-25/2/2019-CW-II Dated: 18.12.2019 regarding the subject cited above. In this context, it is submitted that no funds were received by District Child Protection Services Officers Leh/Kargil till 31.10.2019 as expenditure was being incurred by the Mission Director, ICPS, J&K. the Utilization certificate (UC) upto 31.10.2019 shall be submitted by Mission Director, ICPS, of Erstwhile J&K State. However, Rs: 23.52lacs(twenty three lacs and fifty two thousands) have been received as "Grant in Aid" through UT of Jammu and Kashmir during February/ March 2020 and the utilization of the same will be submitted by the UT of Ladakh shortly.

Commissioner/Secretary, Social Welfare Department, UT of Ladakh, on behalf of UT Administration, shall sign Memorandum of Understanding between the President of India and Administrator of Union Territory of Ladakh on a convenient date to be communicated by the Ministry of Women and Child Development, Govt of India. Soft Copy of MOU is enclosed.

The need analysis of vulnerable children is completed in District Leh whileas same is in progress in District Kargil and the report shall be submitted separately in due course.

You are requested to convey a suitable date and time for signing the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) at New Delhi.

WHEREAS, it has been the concern of the FIRST PARTY that the Constitution of India recognizes the vulnerable position of children and their Right to Protection, WHEREAS, the FIRST PARTY is committed to ensure a safe and secure environment for all children for their all round and healthy development, and WHEREAS in pursuance of the aforementioned commitments the FIRST PARTY has launched a centrally sponsored scheme called 'Child Protection Service'.

Union Territory under CPS and accordingly make timely budgetary provisions in the Union Territory Budget. The SECOND PARTY will, at the time of making a request for release of installment, furnish a 'Utilization Certificate' of the total amount, i.e., Central

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and Union Territory share, of the previous installment in prescribed format and will certify its "Union Territory Matching Share" in line with the provisions laid down in para 3.9 of this MOU.

- 3.6 The SECOND PARTY will implement the existing projects/institutions under the scheme that have been brought under ICPS namely (i) Integrated Programme for Street Children; (ii) A Programme for Juvenile Justice; and (iii) Scheme of Assistance to Homes for Children (Shishu Greh) to Promote In-country Adoption as per the CPS norms.
- 3.7.1 The SECOND PARTY will develop an Implementation Schedule so as to ensure that the following structures are set up within a period of three months from the date of signing of this MOU:
- (a) Union Territory Child Protection Society;
- (b) Union Territory Adoption Resource Agency;
- (c) Juvenile Justice Boards in each district;
- (d) Child Welfare Committees in each district; and
- (e) Special Juvenile Police Units in each district and designate a Child Welfare Officer in each police station.
- 3.7.2 And the following structures are set up within a period of six months from the date of signing of this MOU:
- (a) District Child Protection Society in each district;
- (b) Specialized Adoption Agency in each district;
- (c) Adoption Coordinating Agency.
- 3.8 The SECOND PARTY will establish and maintain all institutions either by itself or in association with voluntary organizations as per the provisions laid down under the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015.
- 3.9 The FIRST PARTY and the SECOND PARTY will jointly share the expenditure for various components as laid down in the scheme document in the following ratios:
- (a) 100 Per Cent funding by the FIRST PARTY to all structural mechanisms and services under the Government of India like Child Protection Division in National Institution of Public Cooperation & its Regional Centers, Central Adoption Resource Agency, Childline Service, Central Project Support Unit;
- (b) 100 Per Cent funding for all components with NGO participation;
- (c) 100 Per Cent funding for all components Juvenile Justice Boards (JJBs), Child Welfare Committees (CWCs) and NGO run projects;

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- (d) 100 Per Cent funding for the JJBs and CWCs.
- 3.10 The Central share of funds under CPS will be released to the UT Administration and through them to the Union Territory Child Protection Society, in two installments every year.
- 3.11 The SECOND PARTY will transfer both, their share of funds and the share of the FIRST PARTY, to the Bank Account of the Union Territory Child Protection Society. The Union Territory Child Protection Society will, in turn, release funds to the District Child Protection Societies and voluntary organizations as laid down in CPS.
- 3.12 Any unutilized funds released to the SECOND PARTY will be returned to the FIRST PARTY.
- 3.13 All disagreements/difference of opinions/disputes regarding the interpretation of the provisions of this MOU shall be resolved by mutual consultation by the signatories.
- 3.14 Through this MOU, both parties affirm their commitment to the children of India and agree to implement and carry out all the activities under CPS.
