SECTION 1: Vision, Mission, Objectives and Functions

Vision:

Empowered women living with dignity and contributing as equal partners towards the development of the country in an environment free from violence. And, well nurtured children with full opportunities for growth and development in an environment free from exploitation.

Mission:

Promoting social and economic empowerment of women through cross-cutting policies and programmes, mainstreaming gender concerns, creating awareness about their rights and facilitating institutional and legislative support for enabling them to develop to their full potential.

Ensuring holistic development and protection of children through cross-cutting policies and programmes, spreading awareness about their rights and facilitating access to learning and supplementary nutrition for targeted groups, institutional and legislative support for enabling them to grow and develop to their full potential.

Objectives:

- i) Supplementary nutrition and preschool, non-formal education to children below six years of age through universalisation of integrated child development services to lay the foundation for physical, psychological and emotional development of child.
- ii) Safe and secure environment for overall development of children who are in need of care and protection and children in conflict with law in the country
- iii) Breaking of the intergenerational cycle of malnutrition and empower adolescent girls (11-18 years) through nutrition, health care, life skill and skill development
- iv) Nutrition and health care of pregnant & lactating mothers
- v) Mainstreaming gender concerns in the policies and programmes being implemented by different Ministries/Departments of Government of India and State Governments through gender budgeting.
- vi) Social and Economic empowerment of Women
- vii) Shelter and support to women in distress and their rehabilitation
- viii) Securing convergence of inter-sectoral women centric programmes through an institutional mechanism
- ix) Elimination of all forms of discrimination and violence against women
- x) Prevention of trafficking and rehabilitation of victims of trafficking

Functions:

- i) Framing and implementing legislation, policies, programmes and schemes for social and economic empowerment of women, protection and development of children
- ii) Implementation of Integrated Child Development Services Scheme
- iii) Providing nutrition, life skill education, health education, home based skills etc to adolescent girls through the Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls SABLA
- iv) Providing part compensation of wage loss, health care for mother and infants within support for pregnant and lactating women through the Conditional Maternity Benefit Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahayog Yojna
- v) Building capacities of anganwadi workers and helpers within the Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) scheme.
- vi) Implementation of the Integrated Child Protection Scheme
- vii) Implementation of Rajiv Gandhi Creche Scheme for Children of Working mothers
- viii) Implementation of the scheme for welfare of working children
- ix) Setting up shelter/short stay homes for women in distress through NGOs and state governments
- x) Improving access of women to micro finance for their economic empowerment through Rashtriya Mahila Kosh
- xi) Skill upgradation for providing employment to the asset-less and marginalized women
- xii) Advocacy and building capacity of officers of Central and State Government departments for institutionalizing Gender Budgeting processes; development of resource material to facilitate the same

SECTION 4:

Description and Definition of Success Indicators and Proposed Measurement Methodology

Objective 1

Integrated Child Development Scheme

ICDS scheme started in 1975 in 33 blocks in the country. It is the largest programme in the world for early childhood care and development. The scheme provides an integrated approach for converging basic services for improved child care on nutrition and health, targeting children below 6 years and pregnant and lactating mothers. They are presently reached through a network of more than 20 lac anganwadi workers and helpers through anganwadi centres (AWC). A set of 6 services are provided under the scheme namely, supplementary nutrition, pre school education, helath check up, referrals, immunization and nutrition and health education.

In order to universalize the scheme, the Government has sanctioned additional 792 projects & nearly 3 lac AWCs bringing the total to 7073 projects and 13.56 lac AWC/mAWC. It is a centrally sponsored scheme where 90% of administrative component is provided by GOI alongwith 50% of supplementary nutrition except NER where the ratio on SNP is also 90% by GoI. In order to achieve universalisation, the AWC and projects need to be made operational at the earliest. AWC is considered operational on finalisation of location, recruiting Anganwadi worker/Helper and starting to provide NP and preschool services. A project is operational when project office is set up with a CDPO and 75% AWCs under it are operational.

Objective 2

Integrated Child Protection Scheme

The Integrated Child Protection Scheme has been recently launched for creating a safe and secure environment for children. This scheme is to be mainly implemented through the State Governments/UT Administrations and funds will be released to them for setting up and running of service delivery mechanisms and institutional structures, supported by advocacy measures and capacity building efforts. The release of grants will be made to the State Governments and Union Territories after they have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Ministry. Funds will be released after approval of the project proposal.

The objective of the 'Working Children Scheme' is to bring working children in mainstream education to prevent their future exploitation and also to provide vocational training for self employment. The Non-Governmental Organizations are given financial assistance by the Ministry for setting up & running the composite centres for mainstreaming and rehabilitation of working children.

The Rajiv Gandhi National Creche scheme for Children of working mothers is being implemented by this Ministry through nodal agencies for setting up of and running of crèches for children of 0-6 year of working and other deserving women provided the monthly-income of both the parents does not exceed Rs. 12000/-. The scheme provides for day care of the children by a crèche worker and an assistant, supplementary nutrition and facility for play and learning amongst other things.

Objective 3

RGSEAG - SABLA

The Ministry has formulated a scheme named Rajiv Gandhi Scheme for Empowerment of Adolescent Girls – SABLA for holistic development of girls aged 11-18 years. The scheme aims at empowerment of adolescent girls through various interventions like nutrition, life skill education, home based skills, health education etc. The scheme is to be finalized during the year 2009-10.

Objective 4

Indira Gandhi Matritva Sahayog Yojna

The Ministry has formulated a conditional cash transfer scheme to be implemented on a pilot basis. The scheme aims to provide cash transfers to women in pregnancy and while nursing on fulfilling certain conditions. The ultimate objective is to provide for part compensation for wage loss so that they can look after their health and nutrition status and also for their children. The scheme is to be finalized in 2009 -10.

Objective 5

Gender Budgeting

The Ministry of Women and Child Development is the nodal Ministry for Gender Budgeting. Gender Budgeting is a process that entails mainstreaming of a gender perspective in all policies and programmes of Government. The Ministry conducts training programmes for other Ministries/State Governments as part of its mandate.

Objective 6

STEP

The Support to Training & Employment Programme for Women (STEP) was launched as a Central Sector Scheme in 1986-87. The programme of STEP aims to make a significant impact on assetless and marginalized women by upgrading skills for self and wage employment. The sequence of activities is envisaged as mobilizing women in viable

groups, improving their skills, arranging for productive assets/ access to wage employment, creating backward and forward linkage, improving/arranging for support services, providing access to credit, awareness generation, gender sensitization, nutrition education, sensitization of project functionaries etc. Thus, STEP advocates an integrated package of inputs aiming at the self-reliance and empowerment of women by enhancing their productivity and enabling them to take up income generation activities.

With a view to ascertain the sectoral impact of the programme and also the impact of each project on the status of women beneficiaries, each project sanctioned under the Scheme is got evaluated by an independent agency. The mid-term evaluation is undertaken with a view to remove the bottlenecks, if any, so that each project could help the beneficiaries to thrive in the market place with minimal government support and intervention.

Objective 7

Swadhar Homes

This scheme was launched by the Ministry during the year 2001-02 for the benefit of Women in difficult circumstances with the following objectives:

- To provide primary need of shelter, food, clothing and care to the marginalized women/girls living in difficult circumstances who are without any social and economic support;
- To provide emotional support and counseling to such women;
- To rehabilitate them socially and economically through education, awareness, skill up gradation and personality development through behavioral training etc;
- To arrange specific clinical, legal and other support for women/girls in need interventions by linking and networking with other organization in both government and Non Government Sectors on case basis;
- To provide Help-line (24 hour telephone facility) or other facilities to such women in distress; and
- To provide such other services as will be required for support and rehabilitation of such women in distress.

Target group/ Beneficiaries

- Widows deserted by their families and relatives and left uncared at religious places where they are victims of exploitation;
- Women prisoners released from jail and without family support;
- Women survivors of natural disaster, who have been rendered homeless and are without any social and economic support;
- Trafficked women/girls rescued or runaway from brothels or other places or women/girls
 victims of sexual crimes, who are disowned by family or who do not want to go back to
 respective family for various reasons;
- Women victims of terrorist/extremist violence who are without any family support and without any economic means for survival;

- Mentally challenged women(except for the Psychotic categories) who are without any support of family or relatives;
- Women with HIV/AIDS deserted by their family or women who have lost their husband due to HIV/AIDS and are without any social and economic support;

Similarly women placed in difficult circumstances

Objective 8

National Mission for Empowerment of Women

As part of the Government's commitment towards holistic empowerment of women, a National Mission for Empowerment of Women is proposed to be set up as an umbrella Mission to ensure convergence and coordination in the pro-women and women-centric interventions undertaken by various Ministries and state governments/UTs.

The Ministry of Women and Child Development as the nodal Ministry is in the process of finalizing the Concept Note for the National Mission and has already initiated steps for setting up the structures envisaged under it. It is proposed that the National Mission will include structures at centre, state, district and village levels, with the express objective of ensuring convergence of programmes of various Ministries/Department and States/UTs and of facilitating inter-agency coordination in delivery of services to women.

Objective 9

Filling Gaps in Legislative Framework

As part of its mandate of identifying and addressing gaps in the legal framework that leads to discrimination against women, the Ministry has undertaken a review of existing legislations as well as to identify the areas requiring new enactments.

With this in view, a draft Protection of Women against Sexual Harassment at the Workplace Bill, 2009 has been prepared in collaboration with the National Commission for Women. This Bill has been prepared in the context of the felt-need for a law prohibiting sexual harassment as a form of discrimination against women. The Ministry therefore proposes to organize an inter-ministerial Consultation to discuss the Draft Bill. Another step will be to set up an Inter-Ministerial Group (IMG) to examine the proposed Bill.

The Ministry has also examined the Dowry Prohibition Act, 1961 and identified specific areas which require amendments in order to strengthen the law and ensure its effective implementation. A draft Amendment Bill has been prepared by the Ministry, keeping in view these identified areas. The Ministry proposes to organize consultations to examine the proposed amendments and provide inputs towards finalization of the draft Amendments.
